WHAT IS IT?

Wood Badge brings together leaders from all areas of Scouting - Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Varsity Scouting and Venturing Scouting.

The **first part** is the two 3-day weekends, or one week, of practical experience where you have the opportunity to learn skills and concepts that underlie the five themes of Wood Badge:

- **Living the Values**
- **Bringing the Vision to Life**
- **Models for Success**
- **Tools of the Trade**
- **Leading to Make a Difference**

The **second part** is a plan to apply what you learned in the practical course. You will create and carry out a plan of action. Upon completion, you will earn the recognition; beads, neckerchief and woggle that are Wood Badge.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Everyone should attend!

Wood Badge is a comprehensive training course started by Robert S.S. Baden-Powell, to help leaders hone their skills, extend their understanding of youth and other adults, and go on to new levels of personal growth and learning as Scouters.

Scouters may apply if they have met the following **prerequisites**:

- Be a registered member of the BSA (Youth 18 and older may attend as long as the appropriate Youth Protection guidelines are followed. They do not need to be registered in an adult leadership role.)
- Completed the basic training courses for their Scouting position.
- Capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment.
- Completed an Annual Health Form

Scouts deserve trained leaders and trained leaders deserve the best program possible.

Across the nation, Wood Badge brings together in one dynamic course the men and women who serve as mentors for Cub Scout packs, Boy Scout troops, Varsity teams, Venturing crews and ships.
