WHAT IS IT?

Wood Badge brings together leaders from all areas of Scouting.

The **first part** is the practical experience where you have the opportunity to learn skills and concepts that are beneficial in your work and home life:

The **second part** is a plan to apply what you learned in the practical course. You will create and carry out a plan of action. Upon completion, you will earn the recognition; beads, neckerchief and woggle that are Wood Badge.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Wood Badge is a comprehensive training course started by Robert S.S. Baden-Powell, to help leaders hone their skills, extend their understanding of youth and other adults, and go on to new levels of personal growth and learning as Scouters and individuals.

Scouters may apply if they have met the following **prerequisites**:

- Be a registered member of the BSA (Youth 18 and older may attend as long as the appropriate Youth Protection guidelines are followed. They do not need to be registered in an adult leadership role.)
- Completed the basic training courses for their Scouting position.
- Capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment.
- Completed a BSA Annual Health Form
